Bristol LARS - frequency change

For those interested the Bristol LARS frequency has changed with effect 20th March 2003 from 128.55MHz to 125.65MHz.

Gloucester Approach (which used to be on 125.65) is now on 128.55MHz! This may cause some confusion for a while. The reason is 125.65 is approved for use out to a range of 60miles, 128.55 is in theory limited to 40 miles.



NOTAMS direct from the UK AIS

Those readers who use a computer for weather and Notam information will be familiar with the problems caused when the NATS website was 'upgraded'. You may be interested, therefore, in a new service from AvBrief, which goes a long way towards providing Notams in a convenient and usable form. More importantly, it's quick!

NOTAMS are now available from http://www.avbrief.com for a free two-week trial period, with a no-obligation option to subscribe thereafter. It is unfortunate that it should be necessary to pay for information, which is essential for safe passage through UK airspace, but if the alternative (free) option remains too cumbersome to be useful to occasional GA flyers such as ourselves, then it must be worth a try. If you already use AvBrief, send an e-mail to newsletter@avbrief.com giving your Name, User i/d and e-mail address registered with them. Your guest status will then be upgraded to 'member' for two weeks.
