





LAST MEETING - AFPEX

Last month we talked about the AFPEx flight plan submission system and Steve showed us the basics of the system. For pilots flying from strips, it's a useful tool to not only file a plan, but also close it yourself once at the foreign destination. The system is still evolving and Trevor updated us on the latest changes that make French addressing simpler. NATS have a useful tutorial online that will be helpful for those of us who only use it on rare occasions.

Of course, the traditional FAX method is still available if preferred. AFPEx does, however, allow the pilot to "file and fly" removing the traditional one hour wait for a FAX to get into the system.

Trevor adds, for the benefit of those who were there: "With reference to Steve's description of AFPEx as essentially an e-mail system, I have been unable to find the reference I mentioned to time sequencing of messages, but I now suspect I had been reading something relevant to the IFR IFPS system, rather than to VFR flight plans. Also, at the meeting, I mentioned that there had been a partial simplification of the addressing for flight plans for French airspace. 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

All but one said they would like a summer BBQ, so we will arrange something. The other didn't need social events. Skittles and trips to aviation museums were mentioned by one person.


Re expenditure: everyone thought we had it about right, there was also unanimous agreement the subscription was at the right level.
