SHORT FINAL.

From the Swift Owner's Newsletter come this useful Pilot's Glossary.

- -Angle of Attack: Pick-up lines that pilots use.
- -Carb. Icing: A phenomenon happening to Aero club pilots at exactly the same time they run out of gas.
- -Dead Reckoning: You reckon correctly, or you are.
- -Engine Failure: A condition which occurs when all fuel tanks become filled with air.
- -Firewall: Section of the aircraft specially designed to let heat and smoke enter the cockpit.
