G-VFW E fly-out to Cherbourg - 12th June

We have been notified by Terry Booker that the Cherbourg event is very much 'on', and all vintage/classic types are encouraged to give it a go. It is basically an open fly-in run by the airport authority, but G-VFWE staff will be helping out with marshalling, etc, on the field. Terry is negotiating for 'food 'n fuel' vouchers, so would appreciate a call if you propose to go – 01202 737430. All normal procedures and paperwork apply, as for any private flight to French airspace, and try to avoid over-flying built-up areas, power stations and naval dockyards! Plan to arrive as early as possible to assist parking; landing is free as is aircraft parking, but they would like everyone on the deck by 13:00 local.

An RV-9 is born...

Last weekend Steve Neale went over to see Dave Boxall and Steve Hill's progress on their RV-9A. This is his report on their progress:

"Work is proceeding apace on the RV-9A being constructed by Steve Hill and Dave Boxall near Bath.

RV builders say you are half way there when the airframe is complete so Steve and Dave must be well past that stage as theirs is all done with the horizontal stabiliser attached. Inside work is also well advanced with seating and primary controls fitted. This RV is fitted with both elevator and aileron trims and the dual hydraulic toe brakes are being fitted at the moment. Note the pushrods that give RV controls their positive feel. Steve and Dave are fitting a Wilsch Diesel and the engine mount was sitting patiently in one corner waiting its turn.

Also set aside and ready to attach are the wings complete with their large slotted flaps that allow this 180kt aircraft to land at 40kts. The wings are of a higher aspect than other RVs making the RV-9A not only fast but a stable cross country machine too. The CAA's test pilot Paul Mulcahy said of the RV-9A "Every child should be given one of these at birth". Perhaps that is why the two friends are smiling so much. Heaven knows what they will look like when it takes to the air".
