This month's meeting - 13th March

We are looking forward to an illustrated talk entitled "Small Aeroplanes can Bite, and Why?" by CAA Test pilot, Dr Darrol Stinton MBE. He started with Blackburn and De Havilland before joining the RAF and becoming an experimental test pilot at Farnborough. Darrol was then a certification test pilot for the CAA on light aeroplanes and seaplanes before going freelance with his own company specialising in aircraft, and marine craft design and operation. He lectures at the Empire Test Pilot's School and Royal Aeronautical Society, and now the PFA Bristol Strut about the design and test flying of PFA types!

Last Month's meeting - The Mini Max

John Hamer started originally in the Air Force and his aviation story originated with flex wing aircraft from a 250 yard strip. He progressed on to the Team Max but felt that he wanted to adapt the design to suit his requirement and so the Mini Max was born. This success story is evident in the 51 now flying in the UK and when John went to the USA he was told that he had probably seen more Mini Max aircraft than most Americans! John gave a very interesting talk to a large audience, illustrated with detailed slides showing the construction and ultimately the completion of his own aircraft. Those present should now all be able to build their own Mini Max! Questions afterwards led on to many tales of his experiences of first flights.
