In detail, on arrangements for future meetings at BAWA, we agreed to amend our regular meeting day from the first Tuesday in the month to the third Thursday, for best access to meeting rooms. We will normally be in our usual Room 4, but occasionally in Room 1 (upstairs in the main building; use front entrance). So plans for the future are:

#### Information from the CAA and elsewhere

A reminder that the new LAA online Permit Revalidation procedure is now live. The process was initiated for G-DENS on 15 April; the Permit Check Flight has been conducted (mandatory for this first occasion under the new procedure, but normally 3-yearly in future), and the inspection is lined up for early May.

And a reminder from the CAA, particularly relevant with this week's hot weather:

<u>TAKE 2</u> is a simple, proven approach to help stay clear of controlled airspace. Whenever you can, plan to remain at least 2 nautical miles from the edge and at least 200 feet above or below controlled airspace.

Flying in warmer weather you may want to increase your planned margins to allow for turbulence or thermals to avoid inadvertent climbs into controlled airspace.

There's more information on TAKE 2 on the <u>Airspace & Safety Initiative</u> website.

Most civil VHF channels have converted to 8.33 kHz voice channel spacing and all VHF equipped aircraft are required to be 8.33kHz capable. The CAA is working with the Military to convert remaining allocations before the end of 2025, this includes allocations supporting Military exercise and Training Areas (MTA), Air Defence Identification Zones (ADIZ), Lower Airspace Radar Service (LARS) and Military Air Traffic Zones (MATZ). All conversions will be notified in the UK AIP, pilots are reminded to ensure they are using the latest information

News from Bristol Aero Talks on their next meeting: *On Tuesday May 13<sup>th, Fraser Wilson FRAeS CEng, Head of Design at Retro Track and Air will give a talk outlining their activities and capabilities.*</sup>

Retro Track and Air describe themselves as "The Gloucestershire Company Keeping Vintage Aeroengines and Silver Biplanes Flying". They repair and overhaul historic piston engines from all the major manufacturers of the WW2 era including the Bristol Pegasus, Mercury, Centaurus & Jupiter. In addition to engines, they manufacture Warbird aircraft primary structures and systems. On the "Track" side they have restored many historic F1, F2, F3, FJ & Sports Racing Cars originally built and raced during the 1950-1970 period.

This talk will be held at 7:15 pm at Aerospace Bristol in The John James Theatre.

No booking needed; there will be the usual 'bucket' collection to cover expenses as you leave. Some Strut members will remember our visit to Retro's impressive facility in 2022.

The next AIRAC update is on May 15th; don't forget to keep your electronic databases current.
