

NATS



Following on from our successful meeting about flying abroad we will have the opportunity to learn more at our next meeting.

Some members may be aware of NATS initiative to allow pilots to file their own flight plans via their AFPEx system. AFPEx allows direct access to the worldwide Aeronautical Fixed Telecommunication Network (AFTN) from any PC or laptop with internet access. Direct access means once your plan is filed there is no delay before you depart. This is a very useful tool for strip and foreign flyers with few facilities available. At our meeting this month Steve will demonstrate the system, warts and all.

LAST MEETING - AGM


