# Message from the Chair — and this month's meetings

What better time could there be to come out and get a safety update from the GASCo team to make sure you are managing all of your flying risks in the best way possible! Yes – starting with a shameless plug for our next meeting on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct, when our GASCo Regional Safety Officer will be briefing us on the latest thinking in the threat and error management space. Our last meeting, you will recall, was the AGM – which was well attended and with some great discussion about what had been effective during the year, and what we wanted to look at again in terms of activities.

Perhaps the one which has had most impact already was the revamping of our WhatsApp group – now operating under the name of 'Brissle Strut' – which now has 20 members from the Strut in it (more than 2/3 of our members!), and enables much more rapid dissemination of updates regarding events and flying opportunities. We're also going to be setting up a Facebook Group, and looking to live stream some future events via this for members who can't attend in person – as a more cost-effective approach than using Zoom or other dedicated online meeting applications, which tended to be expensive for only a few online attendees. 
# **Future meeting**

The CAA has published CAP 2590, the Annual Safety review for 2022.

There is a <u>new CAA Podcast</u> on the potential risks involved when flying near or above active gliding sites.

Do you hold a microlight or SLMG rating granted prior to 1 February 2008? If so, <u>CAA ORS4 No 1582</u> concerns you.

The <u>latest report</u> from the Airprox Board stresses the importance of correct joining procedure—including making accurate position reports!

The next AIRAC update is on 5 October; don't forget to keep your electronic databases current.

Bristol Aero Talks next meeting is on the Rosetta space mission. Nearly 20 years ago, in early 2004, the Rosetta spacecraft was launched and began its long odyssey to its ultimate destination which was to rendezvous with a cometary nucleus in August 2014. Dr Nigel Wright was the Engineering Manager for the Rosetta spacecraft platform during the design phase in the late 1990's and also the Project Director for the UK's scientific experiment (Ptolemy) on the Rosetta Lander. His talk will discuss the various technical challenges facing the engineering team during the design phase, the novel industrial procurement approach chosen for the spacecraft and the significance of the project as the last major contract awarded to the team based in Filton prior to the site closure in 1999.

This talk will be held at **7:15 pm** on **Tuesday October 3<sup>rd</sup>** at **Aerospace Bristol** in **The Making Studio.** Entry is free; voluntary contributions welcomed.
